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Everyday Kids Lend Their Voices to Affect Policy and Raise Awareness About Epilepsy

Directly on the heels of the inspiring and historic National Walk for Epilepsy, fifty-five kids with epilepsy and their families converged on Washington D.C., March 30-April 1, for the Epilepsy Foundation's signature advocacy event, Kids Speak Up! (KSU).

A far cry from typical Washington lobbyists, these kids are part of a grassroots initiative designed to put a face and a name on an often overlooked and misunderstood disorder. The kids crafted their own messages—documenting how epilepsy affects their livesto help raise awareness about epilepsy and muchneeded funds for a cure.

This year, Epilepsy Foundation staff Liza Gundell and Andrea Racioppi joined Morgan Earle, her mother Jean and her canine companion Tomba. Attendees learned about the Americans with Disabilities Restoration Act, which is scheduled to go to the floor of the House in the month of April. Kids Speak Up! is run in conjunction with a Public Policy Institute to educate parents, community leaders and volunteers on advocacy strategies.

On Tuesday morning, the New Jersey team visited Capitol Hill and the various Senate and House office buildings to tell their stories. Morgan and Jean shared their story with Fern Goodhart, Legislative Fellow for

U.S. Senator Robert Menendez, Christ Gaston, Legislative Assistant for Congressman Rush Holt, and Timothy Lynagh, Deputy Chief of Staff and Legislative Director for Congressman Christopher Smith.

Thousands Gather on the National Mall to Raise Epilepsy Awareness

A brisk and vibrant morning over 7,500 for the Second Annual National Walk for Walkers came from all over the country in an effort to raise awareness and funds and to help find a cure for epilepsy. At first glance, over \$1.3 million had been raised. Walkers congregated on the Mall in front of the Capitol with smiles, raised spirits and extra layers of clothing underneath white and purple. The route took walkers past Walk shirts.

Speakers, including Greg Grunberg, chair of the Walk and star of NBC's hit series, Heroes; Alan Faneca of the

New York Jets; Geoffrey Pope greeted a crowd estimated at of the New York Giants; master of ceremonies Bob Madigan (WTOP-Radio's "Man about Epilepsy on the National Mall. Town);" former congressman, Tony Coelho, and many others, addressed the crowd. Epilepsy Foundation President and CEO Eric Hargis, told the crowd at the Pre-Walk rally, "You're going to make a differ ence in the lives of everyone who deals with epilepsy around this country."
